Ski Team Members' Tenacity and Perseverance Pays Off

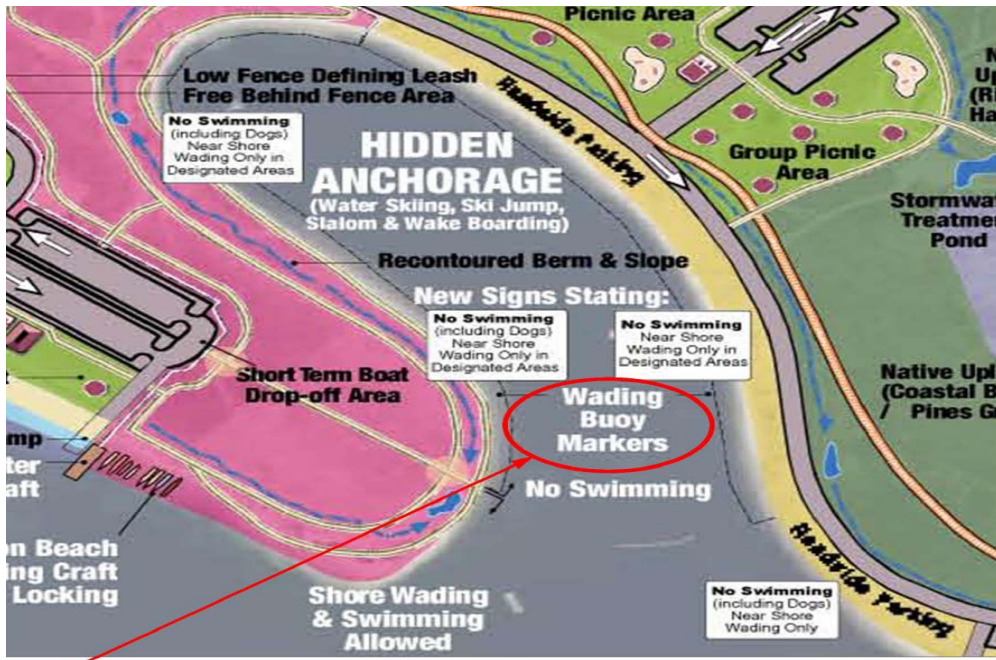

At first sight, Plan 4D of the Fiesta Island Precise Plan appeared to be a win/win proposal for all users of the island. There were leash free areas for dogs, storage areas for paddlers, public rest rooms for all, hiking trails, and bike paths. Upon closer examination, however, you will find that this proposal called for anchored shoreline buoys encircling (continued on following page)

Plan 4D called for shoreline buoys encircling Hidden Anchorage. This plan would have forbidden any boats from entering the shoreline preventing future Blind Ski events.

Hidden Anchorage's waters fifty feet from shore. So what you ask? Without beach access for boats and the start dock, Plan 4D would have very effectively ended all future events held from the shore including Blind Ski, monthly tournaments, Convair afternoons, and would have made it impossible to pick people up off the beach.

It was an uphill struggle. Tom Taurone and I attended the final Fiesta Island public workshop, which was held on March 22, 2007 at Balboa Park. We had a personal meeting with the plan consultant, Mike Singleton, prior to his speech to the attendees lauding his praise for Plan 4D. Mike Singleton is in charge of overseeing the plan that will be presented to the City Council for its final approval. Tom and I were able to voice our concerns about the danger and problems shoreline buoys would cause to all users of Hidden Anchorage. (We had hoped for Boat Club member's attendance and assistance in this matter.) That evening, during our meeting with Mike, we encountered strong resistance. He insisted Hidden Anchorage used to be a swimming hole because of the old life-guard towers left on the beach. You should have seen the look on his face when I explained to him that those 'old towers' are actually AWSA judging towers used for tournaments and were built by members of our club. And, Hidden Anchorage has never been

anything except a 3 event training site. It took a Herculean effort on our part, with the use of many subsequent e-mails and a final face-to-face meeting with Mike Singleton, on the shoreline of Hidden Anchorage, to convince him to remove the buoy proposal. Among our text e-mails to Mike, there were photos of past tournaments, Blind Ski events, a Rock the Dock party, scanned sketches of

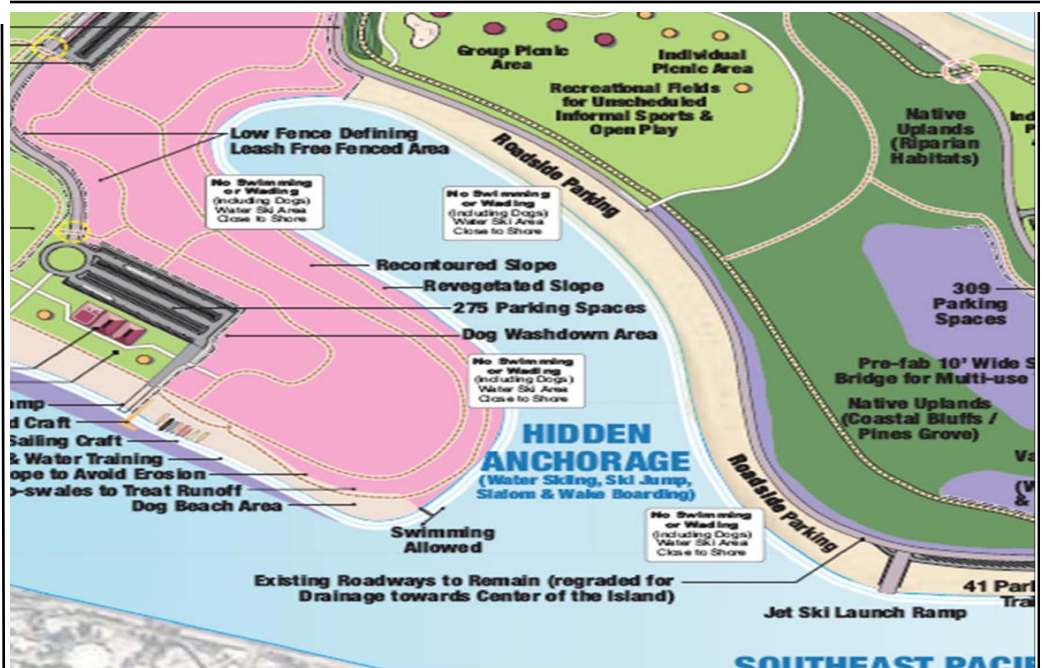
boat paths, skiers' paths, and tubers' paths, and a separate document showing the beach and water usage of a Blind Ski event. To Mike's credit, he answered every e-mail and asked very poignant questions. We had the answers. After a week of this back and forth, a stalemate occurred. We requested him to meet us at Hidden Anchorage.

With the help of my ski boat, we were able to demonstrate to Mike the different functions that take place during all the permitted, sanctioned events in Hidden Anchorage and how we access the beach for all other events. It was evident through Mike's questions and various facial expressions that we were making substantial progress.

Next stop, the April 3rd meeting of the Mission Bay Park Planning Committee's meeting to ensure that Mike's presentation would include his latest plan, sans the shoreline buoys. IT DID! Plan 4E was born. Plan 4E eliminated the shoreline buoys within Hidden Anchorage.

The next stop for the Fiesta Island Precise Plan is a full public hearing. If you care about keeping Hidden Anchorage as it is, please watch for the hearing's scheduled date and mark your calendar with plans to attend.

Traffic Alert!! Sunday, June 3rd, is the Suzuki "Rock 'N' Roll" Marathon Race. NO BREAKFAST will be served due to limited access to the Club. The 2007 Rock 'N' Roll Marathon presents the same great course as last year. The 26.2-mile course begins in Balboa Park, runs through Hillcrest and skirts the San Diego Zoo. Insurance:

Minimum of \$100/300 Thousand Liability insurance. List the Club as "Additional Insured." All members who store boats must provide "Proof of Insurance" to the Club in addition to a copy of your DMV Registration.

Please Note: Vessel Registration Stickers must be current and placed on the boat. Club Rules also state that all vessels stored in the yard must be operable.

Rental Agreements: All Club Members who store a boat in the yard must have a current Boat Storage Agreement on file. Boat Storage is limited to members only! Remember that our club does not hire anyone to clean up the yard. The yard and area around your boat is your responsibility. Please come down and clean up the weeds and trash around your boat. We really need everyone to do their part and pitch in to keep the storage yard looking clean. Remember: Take a moment and provide the Club with your insurance and registration information. Thanks for your help! Wishing you safe and happy boating!

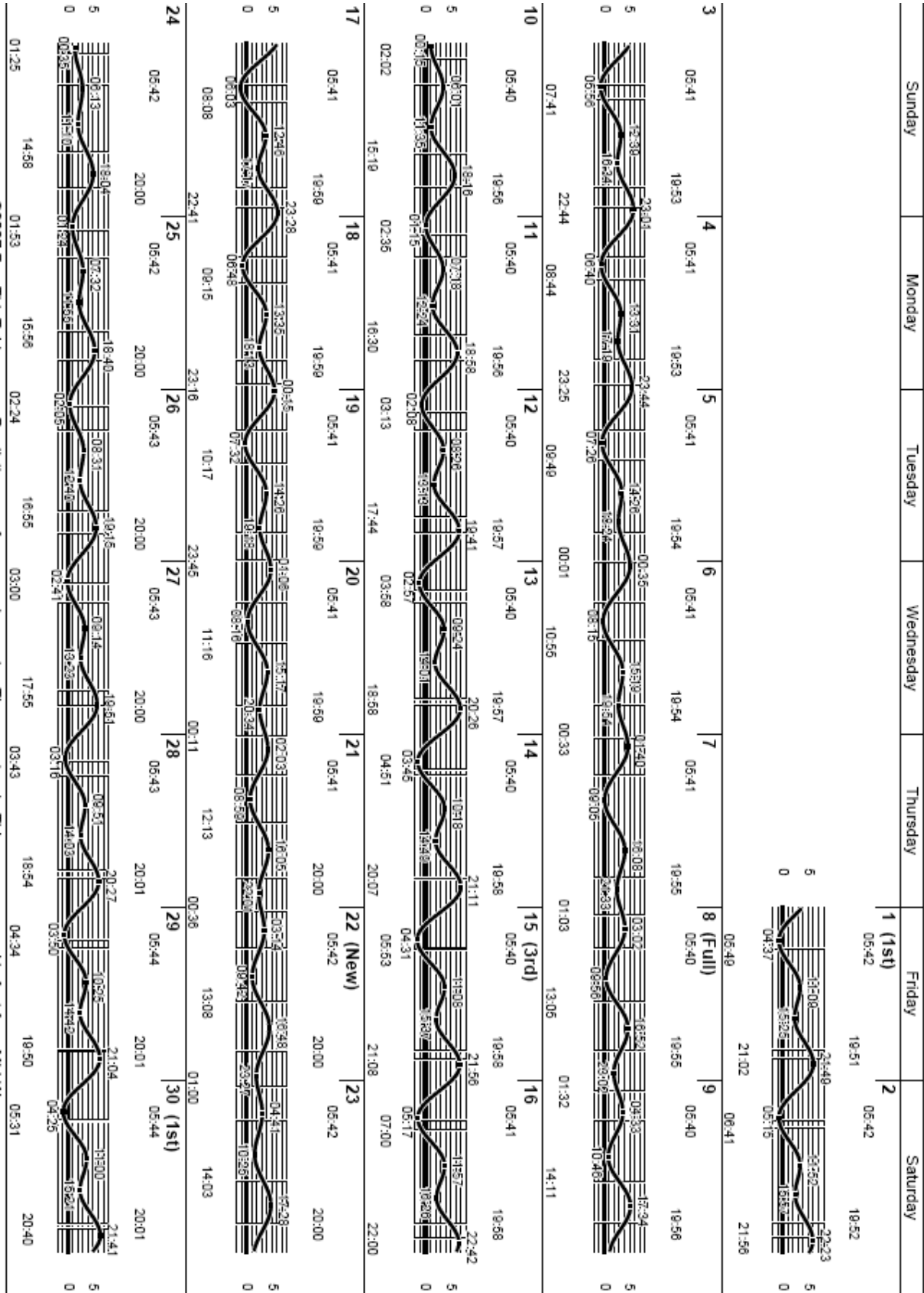
TIDE CHART
