## Boat Yard Updates

Just to let everyone know, the city has asked Commodore Pat Hernandez to do something about the not currently registered boats. If you've forgotten to put the sticker on your boat please come down and do it. If it isn't currently registered, you need to bring it up to date. The city is planning to come in and tow those boats out that aren't currently up to date with registration. Just a reminder, the tents/canopies/structure do need to come down by Oct 1st or the club at the boat owner's expense will remove them. The yard is looking great! Thanks for everyone's help with keeping the yard clean of debris. If you are using the fish cleaning station please double bag the offal to help with the smell.

"Please be sure your boat conforms to Club rules "...

Insurance: rules apply to all boats that are kept at the club; includes boats at the dock!

Boat Storage Requirements: Minimum of \$100/300 Thousand Liability insurance.

List the Club as "Additional Insured".

Provide "Proof of Insurance" to the Club.

Provide copy of "DMV Registration" to Club.

Vessel Registration Stickers must be current and on the boat. Vessel must be operable.

Rental Agreement must be current.

Boat Storage is limited to members only!

It is your Responsibility: Please come down and clean up the weeds and trash around your boat.

Do your part! We also need to have your licenses and registrations on your boats and trailers brought up to date. Thanks for your help! Wishing you safe and Happy Boating!

### Vessel Safety Checks Save \$\$\$

A Vessel Safety Check (VSC) by a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary or an examiner from the US Power Squadron can save you the embarrassment and fine from being boarded by the Coast Guard. When you pass a VSC you will be awarded a VSC Seal that is placed on your port side window indicating that you are current with this years safety requirements [http://www.safety-seal.net/what\\_is\\_vsc.asp](http://www.safety-seal.net/what_is_vsc.asp).

There are a few additional requirements mandated by the State of California that you should also be aware of, for instance the mandatory placement of a CO2 warning sticker near the bridge and on the stern of ALL vessels with combustibile fuel power. If you do not have this sticker, it is considered grounds for "probable cause" boarding by any City, State or Federal agency.

If you would like a free Vessel Safety Check please contact me [calusa@cox.net](mailto:calusa@cox.net) and I will arrange for an examiner to stop by your boat or you can stop by the VSC station at the foot of Laurel street any Saturday of the year.

## San Diego Thunderboat Regatta, September 14-16, 2007 (continued)

San Diego is a 2.5-mile course with huge turns. Boats can fly down the straightaway here and average speeds are often the fastest on the circuit. It's also the only saltwater race in 2007 and that can cause problems. "Try to stay out front," Villwock said, to avoid getting caught in the spray from other boats; "Try as hard as you can to find clean air."

Last year's race at San Diego was a great finish. The World Championship, the National High Points team championship, and the National High Points driver championship were all on the line and all won by three different teams and drivers. Steve David in the old U-6 Oh Boy! Oberto won his second straight driver's championship, cinching it in San Diego. Jean Theoret drove the U-37 Beacon Plumbing to victory in the winner-take-all final, grabbing the World Championship of Unlimited Hydroplane crown for 2006. And rookie Mike Allen grabbed enough points to bring the FormulaBoats.com team its first team championship in the U-7 and earning the U-1 designation for 2007. Dave Villwock and the U-16 Ellstrom Elam Plus have a virtual lock on the team championship and the driver championship for 2007 going into San Diego. That's what happens when you win the first four races of the season.

**SALTWATER CAUSES A DIFFERENT SET OF CHALLENGES FOR UNLIMITED HYDROPLANE RACE TEAMS.** The San Diego race is the only place on this year's tour that features saltwater and that means a different look to the hydroplanes to overcome the water. It (the saltwater) can get inside the turbine and crystallize on the blades," said U-16 Ellstrom's Elam driver Dave Villwock. "The temp goes up and can cause the engine to stall or fail." What's the trick? "Try to stay out front," Villwock said, to avoid getting caught in the spray from other boats; "Try as hard as you can to find clean air." Still, Villwock says even if you are out front, there can often be a haze in the air depending on which way the wind is blowing. "Most teams have worked on systems and processes to try and be competitive in that kind of environment." Boat teams run different cowlings at San Diego to try to fight off the salt water.

**SEATTLE 2007: IT'S THE U-6 OH BOY! OBERTO AND STEVE DAVID WINNING SEAFAIR'S UNLIMITED HYDROPLANE RACE.** Seafair was the kind of racing we'd been waiting for all season. Six different drivers won the eight preliminary heats. In the final, Steve David drove the U-6 Oh Boy! Oberto to victory.

### FINAL: THE LAMB WESTON COLUMBIA CUP FOR UNLIMITED HYDROPLANES IN TRI-CITIES, WASH. JULY 29, 2007.

Final heat: Dave Villwock earned his fourth consecutive win in the American Boat Racing Association Unlimited Hydroplane Series with a victory in the winner-take-all final of the Lamb Weston Columbia Cup for Unlimited Hydroplanes in Tri-Cities, Washington. Villwock piloted the U-16 Miss Ellstrom Elam Plus from lane four past a hard-charging U-6 Oh Boy! Oberto in the final turn of lap two and never looked back winning by three roostertails. one, and finished seventh. "We were politicking around all day for what we were going to do and we decided to let me go out there and go for some big speed," said Villwock. "And the crew made a great decision to let me have just that."

### SAN DIEGO 2007: DAVE VILLWOCK & U-16 ELLSTROM'S ELAM HAVE A VIRTUAL LOCK ON THE U-1 DESIGNATION FOR 2007

Unless something really bizarre happens, it looks like the U-1 will be headed back to the Elam team for the 2007 and Dave Villwock will win the driver's championship. About the only way that could change would be if Villwock and the Elam got shut out at San Diego and Steve David and the U-6 won every heat and the final.

He wanted to bring music into the club but also envisioned larger festivals outdoors, sort of like Humphrey's has. He gave me the date of September 11, 2004 so it seemed logical to dedicate the show to the memory of those lost on 9/11/01. We called it The Patriot Party and it was a hit. We changed the name to Band Camp and had 3 more such festivals in 2005 and 2 last year. This year we decided to do just one well-planned event.

*Q: Most memorable Band Camp moment?*

A: The stages are set facing each other at opposite ends of the property so while one band is performing the next band is getting set up and quietly checking their sound. My favorite moment was when Sweettooth and Deadline Friday had a rock and roll showdown; playing music at the same time from both stages... it was very cool.

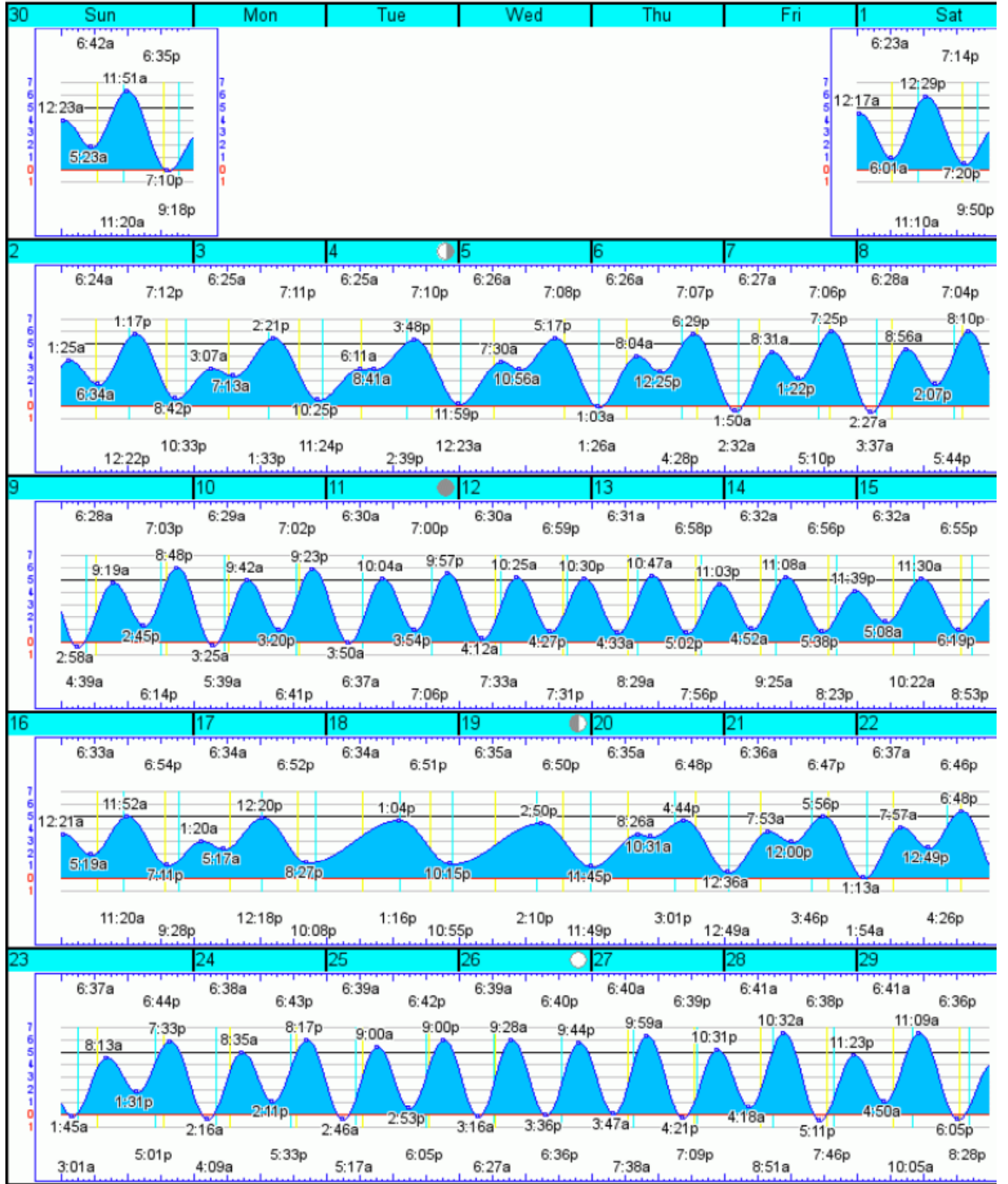
